Report on the Financial Statements

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of Aria Hotels And Consultancy Services Private Limited, which comprise the Balance Sheet as at March 31, 2015, the Statement of Profit and Loss and Cash Flow Statement for the year then ended, and a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information.

Management's Responsibility for the Financial Statements

The Company's Board of Directors is responsible for the matters stated in Section 134(5) of the Companies Act, 2013 ("the Act") with respect to the preparation of these financial statements that give a true and fair view of the financial position, financial performance and cash flows of the Company in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in India, including the Accounting Standards specified under section 133 of the Act, read with Rule 7 of the Companies (Accounts) Rules, 2014. This responsibility also includes maintenance of adequate accounting records in accordance with the provisions of the Act for safeguarding of the assets of the Company and for preventing and detecting frauds and other irregularities; selection and application of appropriate accounting policies; making judgments and estimates that are reasonable and prudent; and the design, implementation and maintenance of adequate internal financial control that were operating effectively for ensuring the accuracy and completeness of the accounting records, relevant to the preparation and presentation of the financial statements that give a true and fair view and are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

Accordingly, non-repayment of principal installments of Rs. 34,661,500, which were due till June 16, 2014, was regularized by deferring the repayment till March 2016; and non-payment of interest installments of Rs. 129,159,308, which were due till June 16, 2014, was regularized by conversion into funded interest term loan and deferment of the payment till June 30, 2015. The Company did not have any outstanding dues in respect of debentures during the year.
- (x) According to the information and explanations given to us, the Company has not given any guarantee for loans taken by others from bank or financial institutions.
- (xi) Based on the information and explanations given to us by the management, term loans were applied for the purpose for which the loans were obtained.
- (xii) Based upon the audit procedures performed for the purpose of reporting the true and fair view of the financial statements and as per the information and explanations given by the management, we report that no fraud on or by the Company has been noticed or reported during the year.

1. Corporate information

Aria Hotels & Consultancy Services Private Limited (the Company) is a private limited company domiciled in India. The Company is a subsidiary company of Asian Hotels (West) Limited, a public listed company registered in India.

The company has entered into Development Agreement, dated July 4, 2009, with Delhi International Airport Private Limited for acquiring Development Rights by way of a license over the specified area at the Airport site for developing, designing, financing, constructing, owning, operating and maintaining an upscale and Luxury hotel property. The initial validity of this license is till May 2, 2036 further extendable upto May 2, 2066, in the event of DIAL's term under OMDA (Operation, Maintenance and Development Agreement) entered with Airport Authority is also extended. The Company has to pay an annual License Fee as stipulated in the Agreement. Also, the Company has entered into an 'Infrastructure Development and Service Agreement' with DIAL on 4th July, 2009, for the use of infrastructure facilities and services being developed by DIAL. The Hotel has been in operation since March 1, 2014.

The Company has an Operating Agreement with Marriott Hotels India Private Limited ("Operator") whereby the Operator would supervise, direct and control the management and operation of the Hotel.

2. Basis of Preparation

The financial statements of the company have been prepared in accordance with the generally accepted accounting principles in India (Indian GAAP). The company has prepared these financial statements to comply in all material respects with the accounting standards notified under section 133 of the Companies Act 2013, read together with paragraph 7 of the Companies (Accounts) Rules 2014. The financial statements have been prepared on an accrual basis and under the historical cost convention.

The accounting policies adopted in the preparation of financial statements are consistent with those of previous year, except for the change in accounting policy explained below

2.1 Summary of Significant accounting policies

Change in accounting estimates - Depreciation on fixed assets

Till the year ended 31stMarch 2014, Schedule XIV to the Companies Act, 1956, prescribed requirements concerning depreciation of fixed assets. From the current year, Schedule XIV has been replaced by Schedule II to the Companies Act, 2013. The applicability of Schedule II has resulted in the changes related to depreciation of fixed assets as stipulated in Note no. 2.1(II)(a).

Depreciation on assets costing less than `5,000/-

Till year ended 31 March 2014, to comply with the requirements of Schedule XIV to the Companies Act, 1956, the company was charging 100% depreciation on assets costing less than '5,000/- in the year of purchase. However, Schedule II to the Companies Act 2013, applicable from the current year, does not recognize such practice. Hence, to comply with the requirement of Schedule II to the Companies Act, 2013, the company has changed its accounting policy for depreciations of assets costing less than '5,000/-. As per the revised policy, the company is depreciating such assets over their useful life as assessed by the management. The management has decided to apply the revised accounting policy prospectively from accounting periods commencing on or after 1st April 2014.



The change in accounting for depreciation of assets costing less than `5,000/- did not have any material impact on financial statements of the company for the current year.

Component accounting

Component accounting is mandatory for financial years commencing on or after 1 April 2015. It is optional for financial years beginning 1 April 2014 and the company has not applied the same in the current year.

I. Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the results of operations during the reporting period end. - Although these estimates are based on the management's best knowledge of current events and actions, uncertainty about these assumptions and estimates could result in the outcomes requiring a material adjustment to the carrying amounts of assets or liabilities in future periods.

II. Tangible and intangible fixed assets, depreciation and Capital Work in progress

Fixed assets are stated at cost, net of accumulated depreciation and accumulated impairment losses, if any. The cost comprises purchase price, borrowing costs if capitalization criteria are met and directly attributable cost of bringing the asset to its working condition for the intended use. Any trade discounts and rebates are deducted in arriving at the purchase price.

Subsequent expenditure related to an item of fixed asset is added to its book value only if it increases the future benefits from the existing asset beyond its previously assessed standard of performance. All other expenses on existing fixed assets, including day-to-day repair and maintenance expenditure and cost of replacing parts, are charged to the statement of profit and loss for the period during which such expenses are incurred.

Gains or losses arising from derecognition of fixed assets are measured as the difference between the net disposal proceeds and the carrying amount of the asset and are recognized in the statement of profit and loss when the asset is derecognized.

(i) Depreciation/Amortization:

a) Tangible assets:

Depreciation on fixed assets is calculated on a straight-line basis using the rates arrived at based on the useful lives prescribed under Schedule II of the Companies Act 2013 except in case of Buildings which has been taken as 52 years based on the development agreement entered with DIAL. Assets purchased on or before the 15th of the month, it is depreciated from the month of purchase, otherwise from month following the month of purchase.

In the previous year ended 31st March 2014, the depreciation was provided in accordance with the Schedule XIV of the Companies Act, 1956. From the current year, it has been replaced by Schedule II to the Companies Act, 2013 and the depreciation/ amortisation have been provided accordingly. Due to this, depreciation and loss for the year have been higher by Rs. 134,290,417. Further based on the transitional provision, the carrying value of assets of Rs. 79,333 with no remaining useful life as on April 1, 2014 has been charged to opening balance of retained earnings as on that date.



b) Intangible assets

Intangible assets acquired separately are measured on initial recognition at cost. Intangible assets consist of Computer Software which has been amortized over its estimated useful life at 16.21% per annum on pro rata basis from the month of purchase. If the software is purchased on or before the 15th of the month, it is amortized from the month of purchase, otherwise from month following the month of purchase.

The company uses a rebuttable presumption that the useful life of an intangible asset will not exceed six years from the date when the asset is available for use. If the persuasive evidence exists to the affect that useful life of an intangible asset exceeds six years, the company amortizes the intangible asset over the best estimate of its useful life. Such intangible assets are tested for impairment annually, either individually or at the cash-generating unit level.

c) Borrowing cost

Borrowing cost includes interest and amortization of ancillary costs incurred in connection with the arrangement of borrowings.

Borrowing costs directly attributable to the acquisition, construction or production of an asset that necessarily takes a substantial period of time to get ready for its intended use or sale are capitalized as part of the cost of the respective asset. All other borrowing costs are expensed in the period they occur.

d) Impairment of Tangible and Intangible assets

The company assesses at each reporting date whether there is an indication that an asset may be impaired. If any indication exists, or when annual impairment testing for an asset is required, the company estimates the asset's recoverable amount. An asset's recoverable amount is the higher of an asset's or cash-generating unit's (CGU) net selling price and its value in use. The recoverable amount is determined for an individual asset, unless the asset does not generate cash inflows that are largely independent of those from other assets or groups of assets. Where the carrying amount of an asset or CGU exceeds its recoverable amount, the asset is considered impaired and is written down to its recoverable amount. In assessing value in use, the estimated future cash flows are discounted to their present value using a pre-tax discount rate that reflects current market assessments of the time value of money and the risks specific to the asset. In determining net selling price, recent market transactions are taken into account, if available. If no such transactions can be identified, an appropriate valuation model is used.

The company bases its impairment calculation on detailed budgets and forecast calculations which are prepared separately for each of the company's cash-generating units to which the individual assets are allocated. These budgets and forecast calculations are generally covering a period of five years. For longer periods, a long term growth rate is calculated and applied to project future cash flows after the fifth year.

An assessment is made at each reporting date as to whether there is any indication that previously recognized impairment losses may no longer exist or may have decreased. If such indication exists, the company estimates the asset's or cash-generating unit's recoverable amount. A previously recognized impairment loss is reversed only if there has been a change in the

assumptions used to determine the asset's recoverable amount since the last impairment loss was recognized. The reversal is limited so that the carrying amount of the asset does not exceed its recoverable amount, nor exceed the carrying amount that would have been determined, net of depreciation, had no impairment loss been recognized for the asset in prior years. Such reversal is recognized in the statement of profit and loss unless the asset is carried at a revalued amount, in which case the reversal is treated as a revaluation increase.

III. Inventory

- (i) Stock of food and beverages, liquor/wine & smokes and other operating supplies are valued at lower of cost or net realizable value. Cost is determined on weighted average basis.
- (ii) Net realizable value is the estimated selling price in the ordinary course of business, less estimated costs of completion and estimated costs necessary to make the sale.

IV. Lease

When the Company is the lessee

Leases where the lessor effectively retains substantially all the risk and benefits of ownership of the leased item, are classified as operating leases. Operating lease payment are recognized as an expense in the Statement of Profit and Loss in accordance with the terms of the contract every year.

When the Company is the lessor

Leases in which the company does not transfer substantially all the risks and benefits of ownership of the asset are classified as operating leases. Assets subject to operating lease are included in fixed assets. Lease income is recognized in the Statement of Profit and loss in accordance with terms of the contract every year. Costs including depreciation are recognized as an expense in the Statement of Profit and Loss. Initial direct costs such as legal costs, brokerage cost, etc. are recognized immediately in the Statement of Profit and Loss.

V. Foreign Currency Translation

Initial Recognition

Foreign currency transactions are recorded in the reporting currency, by applying to the foreign currency amount the exchange rate between the reporting currency and the foreign currency at the date of transaction.

Conversion

Foreign currency monetary items are retranslated using the exchange rate prevailing at the reporting date.

Exchange Differences

Exchange differences arising on the settlement of monetary items or on reporting Company's monetary items at rates different from those at which they were initially recorded during the year, or reported in previous financial statements, are recognized as income or as expense in the year in which they arise.

VI. Revenue recognition

Revenue is recognized to the extent that it is probable that the economic benefits will flow to the Company and the revenue can be reliably measured. The Company collects VAT, Service Tax, Luxury Tax and other applicable taxes on behalf of the Government and therefore these are not economic benefits flowing to the company, hence these are excluded from revenue.



- (i) Revenue from rendering of hospitality services i.e., room, banquet, food and beverages, liquor/ wine and smokes is recognized when the related services are rendered.
- (ii) License fees from sub license rights are recognized on accrual basis over the period of space/sub licensing agreement.
- (iii) Interest income is recognized on a time proportion basis taking into account the amount outstanding and the applicable interest rate. It is included under the head "other income" in the statement of profit and loss

VII. Retirement benefits

Retirement benefit costs for the period are determined on the following basis:

- (a) A retirement benefit in the form of Provident Fund (where contributed to the Regional PF Commissioner) is a defined contribution scheme and the contribution are charged to the statement of profit and loss of the year when the contribution to the fund are due. There are no other obligations other than the contribution payable to the respective authorities.
- (b) Gratuity is a defined benefit obligation. The cost of providing benefits under this obligation is determined on the basis of actuarial valuation at each year-end, which is carried out using the projected unit credit method. Actuarial gains and losses are recognized in full in the period in which they occur in the statement of profit and loss.
- (c) Accumulated leave, which is expected to be utilized within the next 12 months, is treated as short-term employee benefit. The company measures the expected cost of such absences as the additional amount that it expects to pay as a result of the unused entitlement that has accumulated at the reporting date. The company treats accumulated leave expected to be carried forward beyond twelve months, as long-term employee benefit for measurement purposes. Such long-term compensated absences are provided for based on the actuarial valuation using the projected unit credit method at the year-end. Actuarial gains/losses are immediately taken to the statement of profit and loss and are not deferred. The company presents the leave as a current liability in the balance sheet, to the extent it does not have an unconditional right to defer its settlement for 12 months after the reporting date. Where company has the unconditional legal and contractual right to defer the settlement for a period beyond 12 months, the same is presented as non-current liability.

VIII. Income and Deferred Taxes

Tax expense comprises current and deferred tax. Current income-tax is measured at the amount expected to be paid to the tax authorities in accordance with the Income-tax Act, 1961 enacted in India. The tax rates and tax laws used to compute the amount are those that are enacted or substantively enacted, at the reporting date. Current income tax relating to items recognized directly in equity is recognized in equity and not in the statement of profit and loss.

Deferred income taxes reflect the impact of timing differences between taxable income and accounting income originating during the current year and reversal of timing differences for the earlier years. Deferred tax is measured using the tax rates and the tax laws enacted or substantively enacted at the reporting date. Deferred income tax relating to items recognized directly in equity is recognized in equity and not in the statement of profit and loss.



Deferred tax liabilities are recognized for all taxable timing differences. Deferred tax assets are recognized for deductible timing differences only to the extent that there is reasonable certainty that sufficient future taxable income will be available against which such deferred tax assets can be realized. In situations where the company has unabsorbed depreciation or carry forward tax losses, all deferred tax assets are recognized only if there is virtual certainty supported by convincing evidence that they can be realized against future taxable profits.

At each reporting date, the company re-assesses unrecognized deferred tax assets. It recognizes unrecognized deferred tax asset to the extent that it has become reasonably certain or virtually certain, as the case may be, that sufficient future taxable income will be available against which such deferred tax assets can be realized.

The carrying amount of deferred tax assets are reviewed at each reporting date. The company writes-down the carrying amount of deferred tax asset to the extent that it is no longer reasonably certain or virtually certain, as the case may be, that sufficient future taxable income will be available against which deferred tax asset can be realized. Any such write-down is reversed to the extent that it becomes reasonably certain or virtually certain, as the case may be, that sufficient future taxable income will be available

Deferred tax assets and deferred tax liabilities are offset, if a legally enforceable right exists to setoff current tax assets against current tax liabilities and the deferred tax assets and deferred taxes relate to the same taxable entity and the same taxation authority.

IX. Earnings per share

Basic earnings per share are calculated by dividing the net profit or loss for the period attributable to equity shareholders (after deducting preference dividends and attributable taxes) by the weighted average number of equity shares outstanding during the period. Partly paid equity shares are treated as a fraction of an equity share to the extent that they are entitled to participate in dividends relative to a fully paid equity share during the reporting period. The weighted average number of equity shares outstanding during the period is adjusted for events such as bonus issue, bonus element in a rights issue, share split, and reverse share split (consolidation of shares) that have changed the number of equity shares outstanding, without a corresponding change in resources.

For the purpose of calculating diluted earnings per share, the net profit or loss for the period attributable to equity shareholders and the weighted average number of shares outstanding during the period are adjusted for the effects of all dilutive potential equity shares.

X. Provisions

A provision is recognized when the company has a present obligation as a result of past event, it is probable that an outflow of resources embodying economic benefits will be required to settle the obligation and a reliable estimate can be made of the amount of the obligation. Provisions are not discounted to their present value and are determined based on the best estimate required to settle the obligation at the reporting date. These estimates are reviewed at each reporting date and adjusted to reflect the current best estimates.

Where the company expects some or all of a provision to be reimbursed, for example under an insurance contract, the reimbursement is recognized as a separate asset but only when the

reimbursement is virtually certain. The expense relating to any provision is presented in the statement of profit and loss net of any reimbursement.

XI. Contingent Liabilities

A contingent liability is a possible obligation that arises from past events whose existence will be confirmed by the occurrence or non-occurrence of one or more uncertain future events beyond the control of the company or a present obligation that is not recognized because it is not probable that an outflow of resources will be required to settle the obligation. A contingent liability also arises in extremely rare cases where there is a liability that cannot be recognized because it cannot be measured reliably. The company does not recognize a contingent liability but discloses its existence in the financial statements.

XII. Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents for the purposes of cash flow statement comprise cash at bank and in hand and short-term investments with an original maturity of three months or less.

b. Terms / rights attached to Equity Shares

The Company has only one class of equity shares having a par value of Rs. 10/, per share. Each holder of equity share is entitled to one vote per share. The Company declares and pays dividends in Indian Rupees. The dividend proposed by the Board of Directors is subject to the approval of the shareholders in the ensuing annual general meeting.

During the year ended 31st March 2015, the amount of per share dividend recognized as distribution to equity shareholders was Nil (Previous Period - Nil).

In the event of liquidation of the Company, the holders of equity shares will be entitled to receive remaining assets of the Company, after distribution of all preferential amounts. The distribution will be in proportion to the number of equity shares held by the shareholders. The compulsority convertible preference shares have a coupon rate of 0.01% p.a. and have term of 6 years from the date of issuance. Compulsorily convertible preference shares shall automatically be converted into equity shares in the ratio of 1:1.

Subject to the provisions of Investment Agreement, Statutory and other approvals, if any, the holding Company Asian Hotels(West) Limited(AHWL) and the Company shall provide the investors (IL&FS Group) the first exit option after 31st March 2015 are 13,461,538 Equity Shares of Rs. 10/* each, fully paid up and 17,307,692 Compulsorily Convertible Preference Shares (CCPS) of Rs. 10'- each fully paid up) with Equity shares of AHWL, not exceeding 14 % of the issued and paid up equity share capital of AHWL, on a Fully Diluted Basis, which is under discussion with investor.

The Company is confident that it does not require any adjustment to the carrying value or classification of balances to the financial statements.

The Company shall convert, subject to the provisions of the Investment Agreement entered into with the investors, as based on the present estimates of the aggregate project cost, the CCPS into Equity Shares of the Company in the ratio of 1:1 i.e. one Equity Share in lieu of one CCPS latest by 6 years from the date of issuance (viz 30th April 2011).

The Optionally Convertible Preference Shares (OCPS) represent zero percent coupon rate optionally convertible shares of Rs. 10/- each.

The OCPS shares carry no voting rights except for one vote per share only on resolutions placed before the Company which directly affect their rights. Economic Assumptions

The discounting rate is based on the market yields available on Government bonds at the accounting date with a term that matches that of the liabilities. For the current valuation a discount rate of 7.75% p.a. (previous year 8.50%) compound, has been used in consultation with the employer.

Salary Growth Rate

The salary growth rate usually consists of at least three components, viz. seniority, regular increments and promotional increase and price inflation. In addition to this any commitments by the management regarding future salary increases and the Company's philosophy towards employee remuneration are also to be taken into account.
